


Our Insch School community is unique and very special to us.

In P1 we use 'Play' as a major part of learning and the school day.

This will be an even more important aspect of your child's day in August to ensure smooth transitions from Home Learning + Nursery into Insch School.

Class Day



Children have play times (small and large break) and it is important that they have time outside in the playground for fresh air and exercise.

Children must keep within the boundaries of the school grounds at all times to keep themselves and other safe.


To begin with the children will have their Buddies to support them in the playground and helping them with social aspects of school.

Emotional Regulation/ Mindfulness

Over the last year, we have spent a lot of time developing an ethos of Emotional Regulation.

Please see the Guide to this and relaxation which is in your pack.

We will be running more parental workshops on this subject next year so please keep an eye out for this.



In Insch School we have a Buddy system in place to aid transition between Nursery and Primary 1. We have found that this works well!

The P7 Buddies take their responsibilities very seriously.

In turn, the children build strong relationships with each other, supporting and giving guidance where necessary.

The P1s LOVE their buddies and will

remember them for years to come.





Bertie the Bear

Every Child in Primary One will receive a Bertie the Bear 'on loan' to help with the transition between home learning/Nursery and Primary School.

In addition to using these in this transition period. The teacher's plan to use these during Term 1 at school.
