In Pointillism the painting is made up entirely of small dots of pure color.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Research this way of painting and look for some ideas on the internet.</li> <li>• Create your own pointillism picture.</li> <li>• A handy tip is to use an outline of a drawing then a cotton bud and paint to fill with colour.</li> </ul>

Here are some for you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Paint stones</li> <li>• Make a dreamcatcher</li> <li>• Make a birdfeeder</li> <li>• Paper weaving</li> <li>• Paint old jars for candle holders/pencil pots</li> <li>• Decorate plant pots</li> <li>• Upcycle some old photo frames</li> <li>• Origami</li> </ul>	<p><b>Still life drawing</b> A still life drawing is when an artist collects natural/everyday objects and arranges them together to draw.</p> <p>-Collect 3 or 4 things from around your house and arrange them on a table/surface.        -If you have a patterned cloth/material to go underneath it would be good.        -Try to sketch the objects from your perspective        -Check online for some ideas.        -Examples of objects; bottles, plants, jugs, fruit etc.</p>
